# From the editor

"what is best about the Cotswold Water Park... local communities working together to put on a truly memorable pageant"

WELCOME TO the first Cotswold Water Park Life issue of 2010.

The year has got off to a spectacular start with the second Willow Lantern Pageant which took place at Lake Pochard on the Spine Road this February. Having attended myself, I can vouch for what a spectacular event it was, illustrating what is best about the Cotswold Water Park - a stunning location, a celebration of the local wildlife, and local communities working together to put on a truly memorable pageant. ## Gravel is Great takes to the road

A BRAND new roadshow for primary schools called Gravel is Great has now been launched, and is available for booking by teachers. At an event held at the Cotswold Water Park Four Pillars Hotel, attended by more than 50 people, teachers and other interested parties were able to see the newly created resources, including a set of realistic mini gravel pits, complete with camping sites, water sports, parks and nature reserves - all in miniature.

The primary school children will watch the introductory DVD then follow up with hands on classroom sessions. Trials with the new resources have already taken place and been well received with one pupil from Chesterton Junior School in Cirencester saying "This was the best lesson ever!"

A number of teachers have been involved in the planning and development of the roadshow so I hope it will prove to be a valuable additional resource for schools. The aim of the roadshow is also to present the landscape and story of the Cotswold Water Park in a fun and accessible way, to help people understand how much is going on around them"

Who manages the Cotswold Water Park? The Cotswold Water Park Society was set up in 1996 as an independent not-for-profit environmental body by the four local authorities to improve public access, to make the Cotswold Water Park a better environment for wildlife and people and to further inward investment. Over the last 10 years, the Society has raised 3.5 million pounds for the benefit of the local community.

The Society manages several Nature Reserves, bird hides plus five free car parks and 40km of footpaths. It also works with the mineral companies, sport and leisure providers, local businesses, councils and communities to create a sustainable future for the Cotswold Water Park. The Society works in partnership with the four local authorities which make up the Water Park via the Cotswold Water Park Joint Committee to provide a future strategic direction for the area.



The Cotswold Water Park Trust is an independent charity set up by the Cotswold Water Park Society to improve the area for wildlife and people by working in partnership with local organisations. Funding comes from grants, statutory bodies, the five local authorities, landfill operators and other grant giving trusts, so fundraising is a vital part of our work.



What can you do in the park? A number of angling clubs control the rights to lakes that can be fished on 24 hour or season tickets, and at relatively low cost.



Watersports... From the speed of waterskiing to the calm rhythm of rowing, there are watersports for everyone in the Cotswold Water Park. With such a huge variety of sports from wakeboarding to windsurfing, snorkelling to sailing, choose from a taster session, a series of lessons, or just a day out with the family. ## Water voles continue their road to recovery

THE FINAL report on the last two years work of the Water Vole Recovery Programme by the Cotswold Water Park Society has now been completed with positive results.

The results concluded that the range of water voles in the western section of the Cotswold Water Park has remained stable or expanded since a 2004 survey. The report includes recommendations for habitat enhancements to facilitate the spread of water voles further and recommendations for the future running of this important programme.

The water vole was once a common sight along the banks of rivers, streams, canals, lakes and ponds in Britain. However, as a result of habitat loss and degradation and predation by the American mink they have suffered a

catastrophic decline; the most serious decline of any wild mammal in Britain in the last 100 years.
Considerable effort by the Cotswold Water Park Society, local landowners and volunteers, is resulting in an increase in the range of water

# Barn Owl conservation work reaps rewards

A COTSWOLD Water Park farmer has won the prestigious

Gloucestershire Silver Pintail Award for conservation, awarded each year in the county by Gloucestershire Farming & Wildlife Advisory Group (FWAG). Bob Spackman and his team at Manor Farm, Kempsford won the Award in 2009 for the excellent work they have undertaken for Barn Owl conservation on the farm.

Wildlife and conservation is very much at the heart of the farming enterprise at Manor Farm, Kempsford. Through the existing Countryside Stewardship Scheme new meadows have been created, ditch management for water voles has been introduced and artificial otter holts have been created. The local Barn Owl population has benefitted from the new meadows and arable margins, and following the installation of new nest boxes, two pairs of Barn Owls breed on the farm each year.

The coveted Award was judged by Kevin Rylands, RSPB farmland Conservation adviser, and Ian Boyd, last year's winner of the Silver Pintail. The winner was announced at Gloucestershire FWAGs Annual General Meeting in December 2009, held at Calmsden Manor.

Gareth Harris, Biodiversity Officer for the Cotswold Water Park Society, is delighted that Mr Spackman won this Award; "Bob, Simon and John, work hard for wildlife on the farm and surrounding area, involving members of the local community such as Brian Coram whose passion for conservation is an inspiration. The Barn Owls are a superb indicator of the great health of Bob's farmland demonstrating that if the management is right, the food chain is also healthy, with species such as Barn Owl being right at the top. Well done Bob!"




